Scientists from around Africa gather to develop leadership capacity in the third round of the ASLP

Twenty-two outstanding scientists from all major regions within Africa will participate in the third round of the Africa Science Leadership Programme (ASLP). The scientists represent basic and applied sciences, and span a wide variety of disciplines including the social sciences and humanities.

The program on 'Leading a new paradigm for African Science' starts on 22 March with a week-long workshop. The fellows will dive deeply into topics such as collective leadership and science communication. Leaders in academia and research, science communication, and leadership theory and practice will join the fellows for interactive sessions. The workshop will be followed by a year of application and mentorship, with a follow-up workshop planned for March 2018.

The <u>2017 ASLP fellows</u> will meet with the <u>2016 cohort</u> of fellows on 27 March, when the 2016 fellows start their second workshop.

"I highly appreciate the ASLP initiative. It has given me an unexpected vision of what leadership is. The programme provides important training for African scientific leaders and is also an excellent network-building programme that brings together African scientists from different countries across the continent. ASLP addresses an essential need for Africa," said Professor Sameh Soror from the 2016 ASLP cohort.

"African science is brimming with potential, but is currently underdeveloped. The ASLP programme recognizes the need for quality and collective leadership skills amongst the next generation of scientists who are steering the development and expansion of this system," added Professor Bernard Slippers, project leader from the University of Pretoria and past co-chair of the Global Young Academy.
