This bulletin provides an overview and highlights of the activities of the Global Young Academy (GYA) in the fourth quarter of 2020, and complements our monthly newsletters (archive available [here](#)), which provide more comprehensive details.

GLOBAL STATE OF YOUNG SCIENTISTS IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

What do we know about early-career researchers (ECRs) in Latin America and the Caribbean? The Global State of Young Scientists (GloSYS) team has examined scholarly literature to respond to this question. In total, 104 articles (in Spanish, Portuguese and English) examining ECRs in the region were analysed to understand their empirical evidence, research designs and conceptual frameworks.

This review revealed that existing literature on ECRs mostly focuses on recent growth and transformation in the higher education and research systems in the region. Several articles also report on academic productivity and, to a lesser extent, issues of funding, job insecurity, international mobility, and gender issues.

Yet, we know nothing about the ways in which young researchers in Latin America and the Caribbean negotiate their career trajectories in relation to larger social structures. Many studies in other regions of the world demonstrate that personal considerations powerfully influence such trajectories. Still, the interaction between ECRs’ agency and social structures remains to be explored in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The “Global State of Young Scientists – Latin America and the Caribbean Regional Study” addresses this gap. This research project will investigate how the personal experiences and perspectives of ECRs relate to larger socio-structural dynamics in six countries (Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Cuba, Guatemala and Panama).

The project will specifically investigate how research environments, mobility patterns, funding, mentorship, gender and diversity, and institutional governance shape ECRs’ career trajectories – and how they respond to such factors.

The GloSYS team is seeking organisations and people interested in, or related to, ECRs in Latin America and the Caribbean to cooperate in the conduct of this study. A good start in data collection can be greatly benefited from such a collaboration. The team is equally seeking institutions and professionals working on evidence-based policy in Latin America and the Caribbean.
