SCIENCE LEADERSHIP AND CAPACITY BUILDING AROUND THE WORLD

Science leadership and professional training for early-career researchers continues to be a strategic endeavor for the GYA, as evidenced by recent workshops in the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) region, in the United Kingdom, as well as a planned inaugural Science Leadership Programme (SLP) in Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) in Colombia.

Science Leadership Programmes have taken place over the last years in the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) states, and this year saw the programme's expansion to the APEC level. In August 2022, the Thai Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research, and Innovation (MHESI), together with the Thai National Science and Technology Development Agency (NSTDA), Chiangmai Rajabhat University, ASE-AN Young Scientists Network, Thai Young Scientists Academy and the GYA co-hosted the "Inclusive Science Leadership Programme for Early to Mid-Career Researchers" in APEC in Chiangmai, Thailand.

In addition to receiving training in collaborative leadership and communications skills, participants were encouraged to work with their peers over the coming year on one of several multilateral projects.

In September, the GYA At-risk Scholars Initiative held its third Professional Skills Workshop, hosted at Wolfson College, University of Oxford, UK. This annual workshop aims to preserve the research potential of outstanding at-risk researchers and scientists by imparting the practical skills needed to succeed in their new higher education environments.

GYA alumna S. Karly Kehoe (St Mary's University, Canada) and co-lead of the At-risk Scholars Initiative Estella Carpi (University College London, UK), led the workshop with Nesrin Alrefaai and the support of UK-based colleagues. The GYA collaborates on this workshop with the Young Academy of Scotland and Cara.

The upcoming SLP in LAC is planned to take place from 1-2 December in cooperation with the National University of Columbia, the Young Academy of Argentina, the Organization for Women in Science for the Developing World - Columbia, the Mexican Association for the Advancement of Science, and Ciencia in Panamá.

YOUNG ACADEMIES NETWORK GROWS, JOINS STRATEGIC PARTNER CONFERENCES

2022 is proving to be a momentous year for the young academies the world over. Earlier this year saw the network pass the 50 mark, when the UK Young Academy and the Irish Young Academy were launched. Moreover, the 2022 annual European Young Academies (ENYA) Meeting was held in conjunction with the All European Academies (ALLEA) General Assembly and Public Symposium, bringing together representatives from numerous young and established science academies from Europe to discuss matters of joint interest.

Similarly, the upcoming Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies (WWMYAs) 2022 is for the first time ever being organised in collaboration with the InterAcademy Partnership (IAP), to strengthen connections and collaborations between the young and the established science academies the world over.

The meeting will be hosted by the U.S. National Academy of Sciences (NAS) and the Royal Society of Canada (RSC) and co-organized by IAP, the GYA, NAS, RSC, the RSC College, and the NAS New Voices Program. The joint meeting will take place online and at Biosphere 2, Arizona, USA.
