On the conference theme '**Re-enlightenment? Truth, reason and science in a global world**', <u>invited speakers</u> with a wide variety of disciplinary backgrounds will give short talks to provoke discussions amongst all participants, related broadly to the relationship between science and society, and relevant to the core values of the GYA.

This year, several outstanding workshops and events will accompany the Annual General Meeting, from <u>science education outreach for schoolchildren</u> to <u>presentation coaching</u>, <u>science advice</u> and <u>fundraising methods</u>.

In addition, the GYA working group 'Science+Art=Peace+Justice' is preparing an art exhibit to run parallel to the AGM and Conference at the Art Museum Moritzburg, located across the street from the Leopoldina. GYA brings you Halle's March for Science 2019



Medicinal Herbs from Indian Ocean Island Found to Stop Growth of Cancer Cells

The work of <u>Alexander Kagansky</u> (Russia) and GYA alumna <u>Vidushi Neergheen-Bhujun</u> (Mauritius), which began with the 2015-16 GYA North-South Interdisciplinary Grant for their research proposal 'Connecting Epigenetics and Natural Resources: The Road Towards Cancer Management and Biodiversity Conservation', has been featured in *Newsweek*.

An excerpt: 'Chemicals present in the leaves of the *Acalypha integrifolia, Eugenia tinifolia* and *Labourdonnaisia glauca* plants were found to stop esophageal squamous carcinoma cells in a lab. The plants were found to contain a chemical that switches on the signaling pathway of the AMPK protein, and in turn prevent cancer cells from growing.'

Working Group and Strategic Project highlights

New 2019 YSAP missions

The GYA <u>Young Scientist Ambassador Programme</u> has awarded funding for two new missions in 2019. <u>Mahesh Kumar</u> (India) will travel to Israel to partner with <u>Mona Khoury-Kassabri</u> (Israel) and researchers at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem to initiate research on sustainable development and to conduct experiments with students at the university and local high schools. <u>Alex Godoy</u> (Chile) will initiate a project with <u>Lahcen El Youssfi</u> (Morocco) to research and transfer knowledge on sustainable water use for securing food production in dry areas, and to develop an exchange programme for graduate students between Chili and Morocco.

These two missions plant a seed for a larger collaboration by transferring knowledge, building capacity, and creating cultural exchanges for research. Together, these missions give a voice to young scientists, promote science as a career choice for young people, narrow the gap between developed and developing nations, and help create new approaches to problems of international significance.

Women in Science without Borders 2019

From 10-14 March 2019, the World Forum for Women in Science took place in Cairo (Egypt) with a focus on 'Science Diplomacy for Sustainable Development'. The Global Young Academy was present thanks to the participation of its members and alumni from Thailand, Peru, Ghana, Tunisia and Egypt. GYA alumna <u>Amal Amin</u> (Egypt) continues to act as the Conference Chair. In addition, the GYA <u>Science Advice</u> working group presented the panel 'Catalysing Science Diplomacy for the Global South' during the workshop on Science Diplomacy at this conference. This panel presented three initiatives in Latin America, Africa and South Asia that are promoting science diplomacy with the aim of empowering young researchers and professionals in the southern hemisphere.

The panel was formed by GYA alumna and past Co-Chair, <u>Orakanoke Phanraksa</u> (Thailand), Science Advice working group Co-Lead <u>Clarissa Rios</u> (Peru) and GYA member <u>Meron Zeleke</u> (Ethiopia), who discussed how crucial the international mechanisms and multi-lateral collaborations are that have been put in place to help train, connect and mobilise young students and professionals around the world.
