### **News from the GloSYS Africa Project**

The GloSYS team has been very busy over the past two months. We have submitted our application for ethical approval at the University of Cape Town, and have responded to the request of the ethics board to provide additional information and clarifications. The board is currently reviewing our response and we are expecting to receive approval very soon. We have also begun building a presence for GloSYS on Facebook and Twitter with the hopes that we can use social media to increase the spread of our survey, particularly to those outside of academia. Please follow us!

We are also currently planning our second in-person meeting in Rabat, Morocco, in October 2017.

In July, several members of the GloSYS team gave presentations about the project: Anna Coussens at the 3rd Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies 2017 (in Johannesburg, South Africa), our research partner Dr Uchenna Udeani at the Developing the next Generation of Researchers workshop (in Lagos, Nigeria), and the GloSYS Project Researcher Marie Neumann at a workshop on Academies' Communications, Outreach, and Distribution of Science-Based Advice to Policymakers and the Public organised by the Network of African Science Academies (NASAC) in Nairobi, Kenya.

#### NASAC-Leopoldina Workshop on Research Communication

In early July, Marie Neumann, our GloSYS Project Researcher, attended a NASAC-Leopoldina capacity-building workshop on the topic Academies' Communications, Outreach, and Distribution of Science-based Advice to Policymakers and the Public in Nairobi, Kenya. The workshop was well-attended by members and staff of many African science academies as well as representatives of the media who specialise in science communication. Marie gave a brief presentation about the GloSYS Africa project as it relates to the topic of the workshop, discussing the project more generally and outlining the research team's current communication strategy. She received positive feedback and lots of promises to help spread the word about the project once the survey is live.

# **National Young Academies**

### 3rd Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies in Johannesburg

The 3rd Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies took place in Johannesburg, South Africa, in July 2017, hosted by the South African Young Academy of Science (SAYAS) and co-organised by the GYA. More than 60 representatives from over 35 young academies and young academy initiatives from all over the world came together to discuss how young academies and young scientists in particular can contribute to the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs).

A meeting statement on the role of Young Academies in achieving the UN SDGs will be published in early September by the GYA and as many National Young Academies (NYAs) as are interested to sign up.

### **Dynamic NYA Movement**

The 3rd Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies also showcased the energy and dynamism of the global NYA movement. ### Tolu Oni at UN High-Level Political Forum in New York

GYA Co-Chair <u>Tolu Oni</u> was a lead discussant on 14 July 2017 at the <u>UN High-Level Political Forum</u> (HLPF) in New York, during <u>Session 16: Science-policy interface and emerging issues</u>. Tolu's speech focused on science-policy trade-offs and benefits, the changing skill set needed by scientists, and the necessity for new forms of intersectoral dialogue and data sharing in order to reach the UN SDGs.
