Oxford Meeting tackles the SDGs in Africa

The Africa Oxford Initiative (AfOx) and the African Academy of Sciences (AAS) convened a meeting of AAS Affiliates, international research leaders, and funders at The University of Oxford from 6 to 8 August 2018. InterAcademy Partnership/Association of Academies and Societies of Sciences in Asia workshop

From 13 to 14 August, an <u>IAP/AASSA</u> workshop addressed how academies can support implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).
