

### At-Risk Scholars Interdisciplinary Research Leadership Workshop, 5-7 September 2019

The GYA At-Risk Scholars Initiative is holding an Academic Interdisciplinary Research Leadership Workshop, co-hosted by Wolfson College, University of Oxford and the Global Young Academy from 4-7 September 2019 at Wolfson College, UK. The purpose of the workshop is to preserve the research potential of outstanding at-risk or refugee academic researchers. The workshop is intended to support the academic integration of these academics by imparting the practical skills needed to succeed in their new higher education environments. To run this workshop, the GYA is also collaborating with the Young Academy of Scotland, Cara, the IIE Scholar Rescue Fund, and facilitators from Inclusive Innovation.
