

Inclusive Science Leadership Programme in APEC

From 21-26 August 2022, the Thai Ministry of Higher Education, Science, Research, and Innovation (MHESI), together with the Thai National Science and Technology Development Agency (NSTDA), Chiangmai Rajabhat University, ASEAN Young Scientists Network, Thai Young Scientists Academy and the Global Young Academy joined hands to co-host the Inclusive Science Leadership Programme for Early to Mid-Career Researchers in APEC in Chiangmai, Thailand.



Anti-discrimination focal area continues

At the General Assembly session in June 2022, GYA members voted to extend the Focus Area group on **Addressing Systemic Discrimination** for another year. The group had initially been set up at the AGM 2020. For the next year, they plan to organise an Anti-discrimination training course for GYA members, likely in connection with the 2023 AGM in Rwanda.

The 2020/22 Focus Areas on **Harmonising reason with sensibility** and **Enabling access to online education** have now closed down.

GYA activities group updates

Our Activities Groups had a busy summer, with public satellite events (e.g., **Trust in** (**Young**) **Scientists SCISO project**, the **At-Risk Scholars Initiative** public Pre-AGM session, the **Science Advice for Policy Making Workshop**, and the **Rainbow Group Poster Exhibition**), two networking sessions on Wonder, as well as internal group meetings to integrate new members, select new co-leads, and formulate plans for upcoming months.

Group work has been handed over to new group co-leads in most groups, and a number of groups are now already planning activities for the 2023 AGM (e.g. **Science Advice**,

the 2023 CILAC, or the UN Biodiversity Conference (COP-15).

and past Co-Chair **Moritz Riede** (University of Oxford, UK) and Senior Project
Officer **Anna-Maria Gramatté**, helped establish the UK Young Academy.
