Foreword by the Co-Chairs

The dust has been settling slowly since our Annual General Meeting in May; if you missed it, you can still catch its spirit by viewing the moments captured on film <u>here</u>.

That said, the GYA summer will also be full of activities. Members are active in advancing the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. You'll find below that several GYA members participated in the third Multi-stakeholder Forum on Science Technology and Innovation (STI forum) held at the United Nations Headquarters in New York on 5 and 6 June. This, as you may know, is an important event in the annual run-up for the High Level Political Forum where heads of state review the progress that has been made.

GYA's Science Advice group is also picking up sustainability questions by organising a Summer School together with the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA), the European Commission's Joint Research Centre (JRC), and the International Network for Government Science Advice (INGSA). The focus here will be sustainable development in the European neighbourhood linked to questions of population development and migration. This summer school will take place 5-7 September 2018 in Laxenburg, Austria, and you can read more about it <u>here</u>.

The GYA Office has been busy as well, not only introducing a new calendar function (click here), but also ensuring that we conform to the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), about which you will have received an email. In essence, this would have informed you about how the GYA uses your data, and that you have the right at any time to withdraw your consent for this use. GYA Co-Chair <u>Tolu Oni</u> (UK) participated in two events at the third Multi-stakeholder Forum on Science Technology and Innovation (STI forum) held at the <u>United Nations</u> Headquarters in New York on 5 and 6 June. Tolu presented in a session on the need for intergenerational dialogue for STI to address the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs; this session was organised by the <u>UN Major Group for Children and Youth</u>). She was also a speaker at a session on advancing the implementation of SDG 11 in Africa through a proactive sciencepractice-policy interface organised by the <u>International Council for Science</u> (ICSU). As a grantee of the ICSU <u>Leading Integrated Research for Agenda 2030 in Africa</u> (LIRA) grant, she presented on her urban health research on health in housing policies.

GYA member <u>John Malone</u> (USA) served as a panellist at the STI forum side event titled 'Implications of emerging biotechnologies in the context of biological diversity: multistakeholder perspectives on the risks and benefits', and also presented a <u>DIY Biology</u> policy brief at the United Nations Headquarters on 5 and 6 June. GYA alumnus <u>Yusuf Baran</u> (Turkey) was an invited attendee at the aforementioned STI forum held at the United Nations headquarters in New York on 5 and 6 June. More information is available <u>here</u>.

GYA Cooperation with the German Junge Akademie

GYA member <u>Michael Saliba</u> (Switzerland) will become a member of the German <u>Junge</u> <u>Akademie</u> at their annual membership inauguration and get-together in Berlin, Germany, on 30 June 2018. GYA Managing Director Beate Wagner and Project Officer Anna-Maria Gramatté will also attend the event. The Junge Akademie also recently nominated their former Board Member <u>Miriam Akkermann</u> to be their liaison in the GYA's Local Organising Committee for the 2019 Annual General Meeting in Halle (Saale), Germany.

GYA member elected to the Israel Young Academy

In May 2018, GYA member <u>Karin Carmit Yefet</u>, who works at the Faculty of Law at the University of Haifa, was elected as a member of the Israel Young Academy.

The 4th Worldwide Meeting of Young Academies will take place in late July 2019 in Vietnam, hosted by the <u>Vietnam Young Academy</u> and co-organised by the GYA. A call for representatives from young academies to be on the Programme Organising Committee will be issued at the beginning of July.

GYA Strategic Conferences Updates

Strengthening African Academies project conference on 'Sustainable African Cities' GYA members Patrick B Cobbinah (Ghana), Ketcha Armand Kablan Malan (Cote d'Ivoire), Chioma Daisy Onyige (Nigeria) and Daniel Ochieng Orwenjo (Kenya) will represent the GYA at the upcoming conference on 'Sustainable African Cities' from 3 to 6 July 2018 in Accra, Ghana.

The conference is organised by the <u>Ghana Academy of Arts and Sciences</u> (GAAS), the <u>Network of African Science Academies</u> (NASAC) and the <u>German National Academy of</u> <u>Sciences Leopoldina</u>, supported by the <u>German Federal Ministry of Education and</u> <u>Research</u> (BMBF). The conference is part of the <u>Strengthening African Academies</u> project, of which the GYA is a partner.

In addition to sending four members, the GYA was also able to nominate representatives from the <u>Nigerian Young Academy</u>, and the young academy initiatives in Benin and Zambia to attend the conference and add the voice of young scientists to the discussions. International Network for Government Science Advice (INGSA)

The GYA, in partnership with the <u>Young Academy of Japan</u>, has been invited to develop and run a capacity-building science leadership workshop for young scientists attending the biannual global INGSA meeting. This year the meeting, <u>INGSA2018 Science Advice in a Changing World</u>, will be held in Tokyo, Japan, from 6 to 7 November. Co-Chair <u>Tolu Oni</u> (UK) is liaising with INGSA partners to develop this programme in partnership with GYA Co-Chair <u>Connie Nshemereirwe</u> (Uganda) and GYA member <u>Binyam Mendisu</u> (Ethiopia) – both of whom have facilitated previous SLP workshops – as well as INGSA workshop facilitators and representatives from the <u>Young Academy of Japan</u>.
