Nova, Maral, Robert, Sandra, and Yoko were all re-elected.

We have now launched our e-Conference for young scientists, with the theme "Heal the Earth: Sustainable Development Goals in a Changing World". We look forward to two weeks of active engagement among the GYA members and alumni and with our guests at the e-Conference.

Aside from our e-AGM and e-Conference, we're proud to announce that we signed the San Francisco Declaration on Research Assessment, and to present our regular updates from GYA members and alumni.

We are also poised to launch our Strategic Plan for the next five years, after extensive brainstorming at the e-AGM. In order to take the first steps towards implementation, the membership have set themselves three major tasks for the upcoming year: to address systemic discrimination, work towards enabling everyone to access online education (especially in the global south), and to harmonise reason and sensibility to build bridges between the arts and sciences.




