The past month saw a whole range of GYA activities. Our members were very active and visible, for example at the recently concluded Next Einstein Forum in Kigali, Rwanda, the largest gathering of scientists on the African continent. The GYA Women in Science Working Group co-organised a very successful 'Women in Science Leadership' workshop, and our GloSYS Africa team presented their preliminary data at a breakfast session. Despite the early timing of this session (7:30am!) it was very well attended and provided an opportunity to identify other pan-African initiatives that could provide synergies with the GloSYS project. Data collection for the survey is ongoing, and we ask that if you have any networks in Africa whom you think would be interested in disseminating and participating in our study, please let us know and share the survey, found <u>here</u>.

Last week saw the launch of our report titled 'Global Access to Research Software: The Forgotten Pillar of Open Science Implementation', the outcome of one of the first-ever GYA Working Groups. The launch concluded the international workshop 'New Perspectives on Open Science' in Oxford, UK, which was co-organised by the Maison Française d'Oxford and the Global Young Academy. Interdisciplinary grant

GYA North-South Interdisciplinary Grant – make connections for grant applications at the AGM!

The North-South Interdisciplinary Grant (N-S Grant) scheme was initiated in 2014, with an aim to foster collaboration across disciplinary and geographic lines that often separate researchers and limit possibilities. Specifically, this scheme facilitates the development of small-scale, innovative, curiosity-driven, blue-sky, exploratory research pilots or prototypes that unite researchers in developed and developing countries and cross-disciplinary boundaries. The N-S Grant is awarded annually, and is meant to provide seed money to enable GYA members to prepare a proof of concept, prototype, or pilot research project with a view to securing greater external funding. The next call for applications will go out after the upcoming AGM, so use your time in Pattaya to think outside the box with other GYA members – maybe it will lead to an application.

Current and past grant recipients and projects are now visible on the GYA website:

2017/18: Biochar for food security and sustainable ecosystem services.

2016: Ethics in environmental decision-making: From individual acts to global outcomes.

2015/16: Connecting epigenetics and natural resources.

2014/15: One-dimensional molecular current wires using tailored-to-the-purpose chemistry.

GYA Report on 'Global Access to Research Software' released

The <u>Global Access to Research Software</u> Working Group Report titled '<u>Global Access to</u> <u>Research Software: The Forgotten Pillar of Open Science Implementation</u>' was launched at the conclusion of the <u>international workshop on Open Science</u>, '<u>New Perspectives on Open</u> <u>Science</u>'. The workshop was convened by GYA Co-Chair <u>Moritz Riede</u> (UK) and <u>Open</u> <u>Science Working Group</u> Co-Lead <u>Koen Vermeir</u> (France), and co-organised by the GYA and <u>Maison Française d'Oxford</u>. The workshop was livestreamed (and stored) on our <u>Facebook</u> page, and videos of both the launch and the workshop are available on our YouTube channel <u>here</u>.

CIFAR workshop co-organised by Women in Science

The GYA Women in Science Working Group co-organised a 22-24 March CFAR Women in Science Leadership Workshop titled '<u>Fostering diverse and inclusive leadership in</u> <u>academia</u>', which took place as a pre-event to the <u>2018 Global Gathering of the Next</u> <u>Einstein Forum</u> in Kigali, Rwanda. GYA Members <u>Ghada Bassioni</u>, <u>Federico Rosei</u> and <u>Fridah Erastus</u> participated. At the conclusion of the workshop, attendees had not only strengthened their individual (co-)leadership skills but also extended their respective personal networks with other workshop participants.

GIoSYS Africa team holds session at Next Einstein Forum in Kigali

Members of the GloSYS Africa team held a side-session at this year's Next Einstein Forum Global Gathering in Kigali, Rwanda, on 28 March. During the session, the team presented preliminary data collected using the <u>GloSYS survey</u> and interviews of young scientists across Africa. This presentation was followed by an interactive session, in which all present explored implementable strategies to address the challenges facing young scientists in Africa. The session was well attended by key stakeholders in science and higher education, as well as by policymakers.

Expedition Mundus

In February 2018, GYA alumnus <u>Oded Hod</u> (Israel) and members from the <u>Israel Young</u> <u>Academy</u> translated the <u>Expedition Mundus</u> game into Hebrew. A limited number of hardcopies has been printed and the Hebrew version of the game is currently being tested and evaluated in several elementary, middle, and high schools in Israel. Co-Chair meets with UNESCO

Building on earlier discussions at the World Science Forum, on 19 February <u>Tolu Oni</u> (South Africa) met with UNESCO representatives to discuss synergies and potential partnerships. Further discussions are now underway to explore partnership on the GYA <u>At-risk and</u> **'No Women, No Panel' initiative of the EU Commissioner for the Single Digital Market** 'No Women, No Panel' is a campaign with the goal of raising awareness on attaining gender balance in panels and public events. EU Commissioner Mariya Gabriel committed to ensuring that for every panel or public event she is invited to, there should be at least one other woman panellist. This campaign is inspired by the initiative of the <u>BrusselsBinder</u>, which provides a database of female experts and a platform for women experts to connect. WEF young scientists Code of Ethics for Researchers

As society gains access to more sources of information and diverging opinions, and as a growing number of reports are throwing the reliability of scientific research into question, scientists are under scrutiny, questioned and mistrusted. To address this issue, the <u>World</u> <u>Economic Forum Young Scientists Community</u> — a group of leading researchers under the age of 40 from diverse fields and all regions of the world — came together to identify and reflect on the cross-cutting ethical issues they are faced with. This universal <u>Code of Ethics</u> — endorsed by the GYA — is the result of their extensive reflections and consultations with researchers and ethicists. It serves as a tool to nurture a positive change of culture in the processes of the scientific institutions that are to facilitate this cultural shift.
