#### **March 2021 Newsletter**

Dear Friends,

What an interesting month March has been. First, we were able to meet and introduce our new member cohort, which includes representatives from 28 individual countries, from all GYA general disciplines, and includes 19 females and 12 males. An important development is that when the new cohort is inducted, the gender ratio of GYA members will be 101 female/98 male/1 non-binary. Such gender balance is a development that we've been moving towards for the last few years, and is a reflection of the excellent female/non-binary applicants to the GYA.

In March the GYA also released, along with the InterAcademy Partnership, a joint communique laying out recommendations to mitigate the harms inflicted by COVID-19 on early-career researchers. Please do circulate this publication within your networks.

Another publication on early-career researchers was also released in March: the Global State of Young Scientists Latin America and the Caribbean (GloSYS LAC) released a working paper highlighting substantial disparities on the region, and setting out a clear agenda for future research.

The GYA International Conference also got underway in March, when we hosted the Virtual Satellite Panel Trust in Climate Science. If you missed the event, the recording is now available - just follow the link below.


