Executive Committee member reports on UNESCO meeting on Scientific Integrity

In December 2021, a global digital exchange of ideas and experiences on Scientific Integrity for stakeholders from UNESCO-related networks and science policy was hosted by the German Commission for UNESCO in cooperation with UNESCO's Sectors for the Natural Sciences and the Social and Human Sciences.

GYA project on the COVID-19 pandemic and art



The Journal of Science Policy & Governance (JSPG), the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and the Major Group for Children and Youth (MGCY) have launched a call for papers and competition on shaping the future of global scientific practices in the light of the COVID-19 pandemic, focused on Open Science Policies as an Accelerator for Achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

The GYA Open Science working group acts as an outreach partner for this Special Issue.

Students, post-doctoral researchers, policy fellows, early-career researchers and young professionals from around the world are invited to develop bold and innovative policy and governance ideas for exploring the untapped potential of Open Science to create a better society, and push for the attainment of the UN Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Young Academy of Europe turns 10

The Young Academy of Europe (YAE) is celebrating its 10th Anniversary in 2022. As part of their celebrations, they are organising a Lecture Series each month, and in March, GYA members **David Fernandez Rivas** (University of Twente, The Netherlands) and **Manuel Fernandez-Göt**z (University of Edinburgh, United Kingdom), who are both also YAE members, spoke at the YAE's 10th Anniversary Lecture Series.

David presented his research on novel needle-free injection techniques, and Manuel discussed his work on approaching urban challenges from a deep-history perspective.
