

The GYA Executive Committee has endorsed the Gago Conferences "Manifesto for Early Career Researchers in Europe", which resulted from the 4th Gago Conference on European Science Policy.

The Manifesto calls for improving healthy research careers in Research Performing Organisations, Research and Technology Organisations, and in Higher Education Institutions, as well as improving healthy research careers in the third sector, including NGOs and governmental organizations.
