The GYA supports Open Science and Open Access (OA) in a variety of ways, including our collaboration with the Open Research Europe publishing consortium, our Open Science Working Group, and now also through our endorsement of the Statement titled "Article Processing Charge (APC) Policies on Open Access (OA) Publishing Model: The Impact on Developing Countries and the Need for a Multilateral Solution." The Statement challenges the author-pays OA publishing model, which the GYA strongly opposes because it places undue burdens on researchers from low- and middle-income




## **GYA** member receives International Science Council award during its 2021 General Assembly

This year marked the first edition of the ISC Awards Programme, during which GYA member Shymaa Enany (Suez Canal University, Egypt) was awarded the Early Career Scientist Award - Africa, and Scholars at Risk, a partner organisation of the GYA's At-Risk Scholars Initiative, were awarded the Scientific Freedom and Responsibility Award.

#### **GYA** commits to be carbon-neutral

In late 2020, the GYA committed to offset carbon from every flight taken on its behalf. After a time of exclusively online meetings, air travel is now slowly picking up again and in November, GYA members **Alma Cristal Hernández-Mondragón** (Center for Research and Advanced Studies of the National Polytechnic Institute, Mexico) and **Alexandra Dmitrieva** (Support, Research and Development Center, Ukraine) will fly to

7,536 kg of CO<sub>2</sub> greenhouse gases were offset through a **climate project in India**, which supports thousands of small farmers who sell their crop waste to biomass plants, thereby replacing fossil fuels with renewable energy sources.

The project supports United Nations Sustainable Development Goals 1 (No Poverty), 3 (Good Health and Well-Being), 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy), 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), and 13 (Climate Action), and will be supported by the GYA during the period 2021-2023.


## Strategic Foresight for the Future Normal of Young Scientists

## **Young Science Beyond Borders conference 16-17 December**

The Polish Young Academy (PYA) is organising the first Young Science Beyond Borders (YSBB) conference online on 16-17 December 2021. The conference will bring together early- to mid-career researchers and students from Poland and countries of Eastern Europe and the Central Asia region, across various disciplines for presenting their research results, networking opportunities, and promoting research funding. The conference features four parallel thematic sessions (humanities, (bio)organic chemistry & biology, computational physics and chemistry & material and mechanical engineering), a session for students and early-career researchers to share research interests in the form of short flash presentations, a networking event that aims at bringing together students and young scientists, as well as a dedicated session on funding opportunities for students and early-career researchers in Poland and the European Union.

# Young Academy of Scotland Sustainable Business Travel Pledge

The Young Academy of Scotland has launched a Sustainable Business Travel Pledge for individuals whose professional roles have traditionally involved significant amounts of long-distance travel and who can make their own decisions about when and where to travel. In particular, this applies to many individuals working in academia and other research organisations. While employers and funding bodies have a crucial role to play in reducing the environmental impact of business travel in these sectors, this pledge focuses on actions that can be taken at an individual level to address this issue. ## First meeting of the National Young Academy of Nepal


