

Tsukuba Conference, Tsukuba, Japan, 2-4 October 2019

The GYA, together with the Young Academy of Japan, is organising a panel at the Tsukuba Conference on the topic of 'Citizen Science'. GYA EC member <u>Yoko Shimpuku</u> (Japan) is a member of the programme organising committee.

Representatives from the GYA/National Young Academies/initiatives from the G7 countries will be invited to discuss Citizen Science as well as the UN SDGs with respect to the Science20 discussion of marine plastic waste. World Health Summit, Berlin, Germany, 27-29 October 2019

The New Voices in Global Health (NVGH) session is organised by the GYA <u>Global Health</u> Working Group and aims to explore the (dis)connection of various sciences with global health research, policy or advocacy. Scientists from diverse disciplines will discuss how their work relates to global health and how their field relates to broader global challenges that usually require interdisciplinary expertise and collaboration.
