Dear esteemed colleagues,

As we near the end of 2023, we find ourselves reflecting on the remarkable journey we've shared as part of our vibrant GYA community. In the past six months, our Executive Committee (EC) has been steadfast in its efforts, leading to an array of accomplishments, for example:

This revision pinpointed strategic targets across four domains: empowering early-career researchers globally; contributing to societal solutions; enhancing the science system; and supporting Young Scientist Initiatives. Our vision is to empower GYA members, alumni, and young scientists worldwide to make impactful contributions to society within these domains.

New Member Selection: We've implemented substantial changes to our member selection process. We prioritized qualitative assessment over bibliometrics, introduced a commitment to the GYA as a pivotal criterion, requiring a minimum of 4 hours/month from our members. Additionally, we've overhauled reviewer assignment with a semi-automated process.

Communication Committee Establishment: We're pleased to announce the establishment of the GYA Communication Committee. We are currently engaged in discussions regarding its specific role and work plan, but we consider this committee a pivotal addition to our initiatives.

Looking forward to 2024 excites us! We're eager to delve into the coming year, which is brimming with new initiatives and ambitions, including the next Annual General Assembly in Washington, DC.


