Women in Science session on diversity in science

On the occasion of the International Day of Women and Girls in Science on 11 February, the GYA Women in Science working group is organizing an online event on diversity and inclusivity in science on 16 February 2024, from 13:00-14:00 UTC. In December 2023, as part of a climate change advocacy programme, <u>Climate</u> <u>Change and Disaster Risk Reduction</u> working group co-lead <u>Ovie Edegbene</u> (Federal University of Health Sciences, Nigeria) organized a lecture on the impact of climate change on the environment to selected high school students in Benue State, Nigeria. GYA signs action against paper mills

The GYA has signed a <u>United2Act Consensus Statement on the problem of paper mills</u>. The statement outlines five key areas of action against the impact of paper mills on the integrity of academic research and publishing.

United2Act is a group of international stakeholders committed to addressing the collective challenge of paper mills in scholarly publishing.

GYA AlumnaPlus and member of the <u>Scientific Excellence</u> working group <u>Stefania</u> <u>Mondello</u> (University of Messina, Italy) was part of the group of authors.

During 2024, five United2Act <u>working groups</u> will develop and execute plans to deliver the actions in the statement around the key areas of education and awareness, improve post-publication corrections, research paper mills, enable the development of trust markers, and continue to bring together the many voices in this area through joint projects and initiatives. Stefania will continue to be involved in working group 2 on Improving post-publication corrections; she will also serve as a Vice Chair of the U2A Steering Group.

Meeting of GYA activities groups co-leads

In January 2024, the co-leads of GYA working groups, incubators and strategic projects met with EC members and Office staff to discuss recent accomplishments and also look at common challenges such as low member engagement in some groups, or the shrinking funding that is available to GYA groups. Preparations for the 2024 AGM were also discussed; some groups will organise pre-workshops and all groups will be present at the Activities Groups poster fair to network, plan next collaborations among groups and attract new GYA members.

Nominations

2023 Nominations overview

In 2023, the GYA nominated members and alumni to dozens of posts with our international partner organizations.

International Science Council (ISC) Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) – Scientific Committee of the IRDR

As an Associate Member, the GYA could nominate experts through ISC to the Scientific Committee of the IRDR. Following a call to members and alumni, the GYA Office received two Expressions of Interest from qualified candidates. With confirmation from the GYA Co-Chairs, the following candidates have been nominated and are now subject to further selection rounds: <u>Saja Al Zoubi</u> (Saint Mary's University, Canada), <u>Khamarrul Razak</u> (Universiti Teknologi Malaysia).

United Nations (UN) Secretary General's Senior Management Group

Through direct invitation to the GYA Co-Chairs, the GYA was invited on very short notice to nominate an environmental or climate change expert, who is also a woman scientist currently in the Global South, to speak at an online meeting of the UN Secretary General's Senior Management Group on scientific breakthroughs. A call was sent to GYA members fitting the request (through a database filter), and two Expressions of Interest were submitted. The decision was made by the Co-Chairs to nominate Ramia Al Bakain (TheUniversity of Jordan).

European Commission Science Advice Mechanism - One Health

The GYA was invited to nominate experts to take part in evidence gathering activities on the topic Cross sectoral evidence-based governance for One Health in the EU. Following a call to members based in Europe, the GYA received one Expression of Interest. Tomislav Meštrović (University North, University centre Varaždin, Croatia) was nominated.

Young Academy of Argentina concerned over current state of Argentinian science system

The <u>Young Academy of Argentina</u> has published a <u>statement on the future of science</u> in the country. In it, they express deep concern about the present and future of the scientific sector in Argentina. The statement aims to highlight key aspects that jeopardize the scientific and technological system and calls for reflection on the importance of framing science and technology as a state policy, sustained over time and transcending any government or political affiliation. The authors believe that this is the only way to achieve a fair and sustainable development of Argentina. The scientific community is invited to share the statement, or support it by adding individual or organisational signatures to the <u>text</u>.

NaYAN members also elected a new <u>Executive Committee</u>, with Mohan Bahadur Chand and Nirina Khadgi leading the young academy as Co-Chairs for the next year.

ISC newsletter for early-career researchers

Following the invitation to young academies to become members of the ISC in 2023, the ISC closed 2023 by publishing its first edition of a dedicated <u>early- to mid-career</u> researchers newsletter.

The newsletter is intended to serve as a communication and engagement tool between the ISC and its <u>Young Academies and Young Associations members</u>.


