


Joint GYA/CoARA AGM event "Reforming Research Assessment to Foster an Open and Socially Responsive Research Culture"

The workshop, which is part of the <u>CoARA Boost</u> project, will examine current research assessment practices that perpetuate a "publish or perish" culture, prioritise quantity over quality, and reward prestige over integrity.

Discussants will explore efforts such as the Declaration on Research Assessment (<u>DORA</u>), the Latin American Forum on Research Assessment (<u>FOLEC-CLACSO</u>), and the Coalition for Advancing Research Assessment (<u>CoARA</u>), all of which seek reform by promoting openness, integrity, and equity.

AGM Biosecurity workshop to unveil interactive video series

The InterAcademy Partnership-funded "Advancing Biosecurity" workshop will bring together experts on biosecurity and ethics, feature scenario-based discussions, encourage participants to explore ethical dilemmas in bioscience, and share their insights.

The "Advancing Global Biosecurity Governance through the Promotion of the Tianjin Biosecurity Guidelines" project stands as a joint initiative within the IAP Biosecurity Working Group, and was coordinated by the GYA through the efforts of Co-Chair Felix Moronta (International Centre for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology, Italy). 2024 ENYA Meeting

The European Young Academies Meeting will take place in conjunction with the ALLEA General Assembly 21-23 May 2024 in Berlin, Germany, and will be coorganised by the <u>German Young Academy – Die Junge Akademie</u> and the GYA. The meeting will see discussions on "Young Academy Collaboration in a dynamic geopolitical landscape", the YASAS General Assembly Meeting, joint workshops with ALLEA representatives and members from the young academies, as well as SAPEA science advice workshops.
