# Ethics dumping cases – ongoing work of the 2023/24 Sasha Kagansky Interdisciplinary Grant project

The project "An interdisciplinary database of ethics dumping cases" was awarded the 2023/24 Sasha Kagansky Interdisciplinary Grant in August 2023, led by GYA member Mohammad Hosseini (Northwestern University, United States) and including Muhammad Zaffar Hashmi (The University of Lahore, Pakistan), Lelia Niamir (International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis, Austria), Estrella Díaz Sanchez (University of Castilla-La Mancha), and Sandra López-Vergèz (Gorgas Memorial Institute for Health Studies, Panama).

Over the past months, project co-leads, in collaboration with a research assistant, have worked to refine their working definition of "ethics dumping" and to develop a schema and code book for collecting ethics dumping cases. The project now distinguishes between two forms of ethics dumping: International and domestic. Read more about the project here.


# German Junge Akademie and Israel Young Academy hold AcadeMix event

### IAP/ISC/GYA collaborate on "Snapshots of Reform" publication

In 2023 the GYA, the <u>InterAcademy Partnership (IAP)</u> and the <u>International Science</u> <u>Council (ISC)</u> released the report "<u>The Future of Research Evaluation: A Synthesis of Current Debates and Developments</u>."

Building on this, the GYA further cooperated with the IAP and the ISC looking into how science organizations, including Young Academies, go about assessing their members. We felt that, before discussing the necessity of reform at other organizations, it would be best to take stock of our own practices.

The new report "<u>Snapshots of Reform – Researcher Evaluation within Science</u>

<u>Organizations</u>" was introduced in two webinars in June and reflects the practices and aspirations of IAP and ISC membership – including Young Academies – and is meant to be the groundwork for future actions.
