

GYA members and alumni publish Nature article exploring academic success in 121 countries

Researchers from the GYA <u>Scientific Excellence</u> working group (WG) have published the article <u>Regional and institutional trends in assessment for academic promotion</u> in the journal Nature examining the criteria used to measure success in academia. Having carried out a first truly global analysis examining 532 policies adopted by institutions or government agencies from 121 countries on the promotion to the post of (full) professor, the authors found that publication and citation metrics are not uncommon, but that mentoring, administrative responsibilities, as well as contributions to the field or scientific community frequently play a role. <u>Read the news item here</u>.

Immediate past Co-Chair advocates for early-career researchers in World Science Forum speech at Hungarian Parliament

"For young scientists, the effectiveness of a science ecosystem often lies in opportunities for innovation, collaboration, and societal impact. For policymakers, it may mean scientific outputs that align with national or global priorities. For society, it's about tangible benefits, such as improved healthcare and climate solutions. This variability underscores the importance of asking not just what works, but also for whom and under what conditions."

In November 2024, the GYA's <u>Global Health</u> WG organised a one-day hybrid global health conference on "Global Health Policy & Practice". The event took place online and in person in Pakistan, Egypt, and Indonesia. It aimed to foster academic and research collaborations, and to amplify the voices of young researchers on the multitude of current global health challenges, e.g., the monkey pox outbreak, climate change impacts on health, and regional conflicts. In December 2024, the <u>National Young Academy of Nepal (NaYAN)</u> organized its 4th Annual Conference of NaYAN, which is their flagship event. This year, the conference focused on the theme "Strategic Pathways for Implementing Resilience Policies in LDCs Post-COP 29" and brought together experts, policymakers, researchers, and young minds to explore and address critical challenges in building resilience within Least Developed Countries (LDCs). Participants engaged with prominent experts and leaders in the field, gained insights into cutting-edge strategies and policies for resilience-building, connected with like-minded peers and professionals, and contributed their perspectives during interactive sessions.

German Young Academy Board Member receives ALLEA award

Viola Priesemann, Board Member of the German Young Academy, has been awarded <u>ALLEA's 2024 Madame de Staël Prize for European Values</u> in recognition of her remarkable scientific achievements in the field of physics, her exceptional leadership, and her profound commitment to fostering a coordinated European response during the pandemic.

In December 2024, ALLEA published a statement on Research Collaboration and Research Security in a Shifting Geopolitical Landscape.

This statement is directed to policymakers, research funders, and academic institutions across Europe and beyond, and serves to inform the ongoing dialogue on research collaboration and security. It aims at contributing to a "European way", projecting a distinctly European perspective into national and global debates for sustainable and secure partnerships.

Academy leaders explore S7/S20 themes and policy impacts

The IAP report A Comparative Analysis of Themes Across S7/S20 and G7/G20 Statements examines trends and insights from Science Academies and Governmental statements.

IAP President and Co-Chair Peggy Hamburg and the Culture Base research team presented findings from their analysis of 10 years' data (2013–2023), revealing links between science-driven recommendations and governmental priorities.
