Early & Mid-Career Researchers: Towards an Inclusive Research Assessment System

Pre-event workshop (public session)

This workshop brings together local and international experts in order to discuss future directions for research assessment, with special attention to early and mid-career researchers. The session will focus on how the Agreement on Reforming Research Assessment can guide academic

stakeholders towards qualitative assessment practices with quantitative considerations playing a supportive but non-primary role, what challenges lie ahead for this goal, and how we can meet these challenges in a way that is inclusive of Global South perspectives and needs. After a panel discussion with representatives of early/mid-career and senior researchers as well as academic publishers, the second half of the session will invite members of the audience to engage with the workshop topic and share their own views with the panel and the other participants.

This workshop is funded by the GYA and CoARA Boost, a Horizon Europe-funded project designed to bring research assessment beyond its current simplistic reliance on journal-based quantitative indicators and quantity over quality.

Pre-event workshop (public session)

In an era defined by global crises-from pandemics to climate change-science diplomacy has emerged as a vital conduit between the scientific community and international policy-making. It seeks not only to inform and support foreign policy through scientific expertise but also integrates scientific collaboration across borders via three interconnected pillars: diplomacy for science, which facilitates international research collaboration; science for diplomacy, which builds goodwill among nations through shared scientific endeavours; and science in diplomacy, where scientific evidence informs foreign policy decisions

The 'Science Diplomacy' panel discussion aims to focus key themes that define the field's current trajectory and future possibilities like inclusion and representation; early career engagements and building sustainable networks. Through equitable partnerships and sustained investment in evidence-based dialogue, science diplomacy can continue to serve as a transformative force for international cooperation and problem-solving in the 21st century.
